Also helps in understanding library professionals' problems and provides solutions. It is very much support of professional development in Maharashtra. Pujar (2014) has also analyzed the messages on the LIS discussions from India. Dhanvandan (2012) has analysed the various forums like yahoo, google groups and the growth of the LIS forum has been discussed. ILOSC group is also useful for jobs for newcomers in LIS professions. There was always the advertisement were published regularly. (Sawant, 2017)

Objectives of the study:

The main objective of this study is to investigate the communication in the ILOSC discussion forum of library professionals;

- To analyse the communication flow of the members
- To know the pattern of members' participation
- To identify the member's professional environment
- To discuss the subject areas of interest

Scope and Limitation of the study

The Indian librarian's online study circle (ILOSC) forum is considered for this study. The messages posted in the month of September 2022, are only considered for the analyses. The previous messages were not considered.

Research methodology:
